## **Course Description**

**Introduction to Ceramics:** This class is a full-year course that will give students a broad experience of ceramic material and techniques. Major emphasis will be on projects dealing with various aspects of technical proficiency. Meets the Visual Arts requirement for CSU/UC. *Note: Students will be requested to donate \$50 per year for materials, although not required.* 

**Advanced Ceramics:** Students complete independent work under the supervision of the teacher, using individually designed projects. Emphasis will be on development of a unique style of work. Meets the Visual Arts requirement for CSU/UC. *Note: Students will be requested to donate \$50 per year for materials, although not required.*

## **Participation Expectations**

**Every class period is valuable:** Staff at NUHS hold students to the highest academic integrity and expect all students to be on task, on time, follow directions, maintain focus, maintain intellectual character and creativity, respect the class rules and the teacher, clean-up after themselves and help-out when asked or they see a need.

**Be kind:** It is of utmost importance that students in this class respect each others' artistic process. We will always speak constructively to each other about our artwork, and be aware that making art puts us in a vulnerable space where empathy, patience, and kindness is required.

**If your assignment is completed**, but everyone is still busy with the project:

- 1. Ask if any improvements, or revisions, can be made to the artwork
- 2. Work on an individual idea for your next project
- 3. Do Extra Credit
- 4. Ask to help out

### Class Rules are as follows:

- 1. **Keep class-time distraction-free** by putting your phone in your designated holder for the entire class period. The only permissible use of mobile phones will be to document artwork. Students must always ask for permission to use their phones.
- 2. **Sit in your assigned seat** for attendance and start-of-period announcements.
- 3. **Do not be Tardy** you will be marked *Tardy* if less than 5 minutes late, and you will be marked *Absent* if more than 5 minutes late.
- 4. **Snacks and drinks are OK**. Make sure to clean up after yourself and put your trash in the trash can.
- 5. **Treat the space, and your materials, like they're your own**. Students will clean tools and personal workspace DAILY.
- 6. **Do not throw clay** on the ceiling, walls, or at other students. Students will receive lunch detention as a consequence.
- 7. **Do not waste clay or glaze**: Always put extra back in the container, not down the drain.
- 8. **Do not talk while the teacher, or guest speaker, is speaking**. Come to attention quickly and follow directions.
- 9. **Projects must be on time** unless you have been absent for a valid reason. Submit a picture of the project to Schoology by the Due Date. 10% deduction for late work.
- 10. **Label your artwork** on bottom with your First and Last name, and year created.

- 11. **Don't take work home until**... It's completely graded and posted on Schoology.
- 12. Artworks will show the highest quality of craftsmanship for each student's particular skill level.
- 13. Work must be of original thought, following the NUHS Student Handbook on Academic Honesty & Plagiarism.
- 14. Students must individually complete the Clean-Up Procedure every day at the end of the period. Instructions are displayed above each class sink.
- 15. Students must work with their peer group to complete End of Period Clean-Up Tasks every day. These groups are determined at the beginning of the year. 10 minutes will be given for clean-up.
- 16. Stay in your seat until the final bell rings. Do not leave early, you will be marked Absent.
- 17. **Students will adhere to the Miner Code of Conduct**, as written in the Student Handbook.

Noncompliance with any rules will result in further disciplinary action and possible restorative practices. A warning will be given, prior to communicating with a guardian.

A paper copy of the Class Rules will be sent home to be **reviewed and signed by the student's guardian and student** together. Signatures mean that they
have reviewed all documents pertaining to the course and are in compliance
with all policies, requirements, and expectations. **Students must return this form, signed by the end of Week 2 = 10 points**

# **Grading Policy**

To do well in this class, students need to complete all the assignments with an attention to detail and careful craftsmanship. All students (regardless of artistic skill) can do well in this class, if they complete all the assignments with an effort to learn and improve. Assignments will be worth points: The letter grades on report cards follow the traditional 100-90 = A, 89-80 = B, etc.

## **Student Absences/Tardies**

Students will always be able to access assignments through Schoology, and appropriate time will be given for students to make up work. Students will be marked *Tardy* if less than 5 minutes late, and will be marked *Absent* if more than 5 minutes late.

# **Mobile Phone Policy**

Upon entering the classroom, students will place phones in a holder with a corresponding number to their name. Phones will remain there until the final bell. The only permissible use of mobile phones will be to document artwork. Students must always ask for permission to use their phones. However, Iphone users will need to change camera settings, for documenting artwork in class, by going to Settings>Camera>Formats>Most Compatible

# **Late Work Policy**

It is important that students complete assignments, and gain the knowledge

of the assignment during the unit of study. Therefore, points are taken off for work that is turned in late (with forgiveness for sicknesses, power outage, or events out of a student's control).

- 10% off for all work turned in after the deadline.

Assignments that were assigned in quarter 1, will not be accepted after quarter 1. Same goes for quarters 2, 3, & 4.
