# **Course Description:**

This class builds novice skills of listening, reading, writing and speaking in Spanish. We will be using the **Senderos** curriculum, with textbooks available in class, workbooks for each individual student, as well as online access to the curriculum material on the VHL website.

All material covered and assessments are cumulative, meaning they build upon each other. Thus, it is very important to keep up with the pace of the course. Class attendance, as well as home practice are crucial for success!

Students will be required to:

- Memorize between 50 and 100 words per chapter unit (called "lecciones" in our book)
- Learn and apply new grammatical concepts each lección
- Follow classroom directions and conversations in Spanish
- Speak in Spanish whenever possible
- Write and read in Spanish, as adapted for Spanish 1

# **Grading**

**Tests- 25%**: This category will include multiple choice exams, one for each lección (chapter), as well as a cumulative semester final. There are **no retakes** for these multiple choice exams. These assessments will focus on listening and reading comprehension, with some questions focused on vocabulary and grammar.

**Performance Tasks- 25%**: This category may include speaking and writing activities done in class, speaking and writing exams, presentations, and daily performance. Students can expect one large performance exam, project, or presentation per lección (chapter). **Retakes** of performance tasks are permitted, usually during FLEX time.

**Quizzes- 25%**: This category will include quizzes in various formats (matching, multiple choice, short responses, etc.). Students can expect frequent quizzes, as much as once per week. **One retake** will be allowed per quiz, usually during FLEX time.

**Daily Practice- 25%:** This category includes all daily classwork aside from assessments, as well as homework outside of class. Work may include completing our workbook, handouts, entry tasks, etc.

Homework could be to study vocabulary on Quizlet, complete assignments on our online website that goes with our curriculum (VHL), or completing work not finished in class.

Scale: A 100-90, B 89-80, C 79-70, D 69-60, F below 60. Cheating via any method is not tolerated and assignments that are not your own work will receive a zero. The use of an online language translator is strictly forbidden and considered cheating (such as Google Translate). Students may use an online dictionary.

### **Late Work Policy**

- assignments are to be completed according to the due date
- the highest grade possible for late work is a B
- late work must be submitted prior to the end of a lección (chapter) and one week prior to the end of any grading period

#### **Student Absences**

Daily powerpoints and assignments will be posted on Schoology, and it is the student's responsibility to check Schoology for missed work. Missed assignments and exams must be made up within one week. Students should communicate with their teacher if they have any questions.
