- CHROMEBOOK preparation for the CAASPP Test:
 - > Bring **100%** charged device (Chromebook charger)
 - > Bring **wired** audio headphones\earbuds (3.5mm plug)
 - > **Only** NJUHSD Chromebooks allowed for testing
- CHROMEBOOK REPAIR LOCATION (NU):
 - > Library: Librarian, or Tech helpdesk. Create ticket for loaner
 - > NU Library hours: 7:45a - 4:00p
 - > **Submit for repair ASAP (2 week +/- turnaround)**

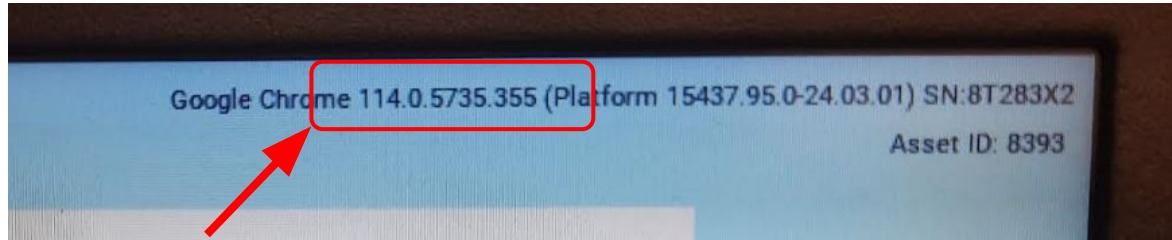

How to update Chrome OS Version (V114)

IF UPDATE IS NEEDED, LOG INTO YOUR CHROMEBOOK:

Check for updates yourself

1. Turn on your Chromebook.
2. Connect your Chromebook to Wi-Fi.
3. At the bottom right, select the time.
4. Select Settings.
5. At the bottom of the left panel, select **About Chrome OS**.
6. Under "Google Chrome OS," you'll find which version of the Chrome operating system your Chromebook uses.
7. Select **Check for updates**.
8. If your Chromebook finds a software update, it will start to download automatically.

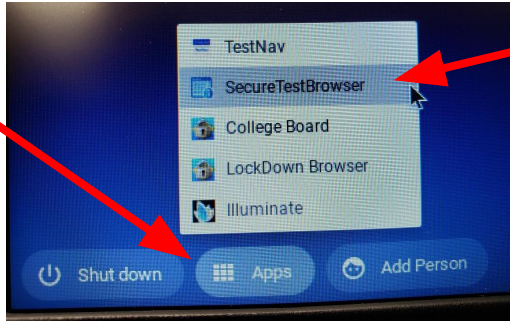


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HOW TO ACCESS CAASPP TEST ON AN NJUHSD CHROMEBOOK

CTRL+SHIFT+QQ = LOG OUT

1. Turn on Chrome device, but do not log in
2. Turn volume up or ON if muted
3. Plug in earbuds or headphones before logging into test
4. At login screen click on “APPS” tab located in the Chrome device shelf:



5. Click on “SecureTestBrowser” to launch test

CLOSING “SecureTestBrowser”

1. On the upper right hand corner of test, click on “CLOSE SECURE BROWSER”

CA ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE AND PROGRESS

- **Early Assessment Program (EAP)** - Exemption from placement tests, and remedial classes in colleges.
- **Seal of Biliteracy** - You must take the CAASPP test to be eligible for the CA Seal of Biliteracy.
- **Scholarships** - Strong scores can factor into district and other available scholarships and funds.
- **Golden State Seal Merit Diploma** - A/B each semester in ELA/Math/Science/US History & Met Standards on CAASPP.
- **Transcripts** - Scores on CAASPP will be documented on Transcripts
- **Earn Pins** - To wear at Graduation - Anyone that “Meets or Exceeds” Standards in both ELA/MATH

Why Is the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)/EAP Important?

CAASPP/EAP provides an early indicator of students' readiness to take GE English and math courses. The CAASPP English language arts/literacy and mathematics exams, also referred to as Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments take place during their junior year giving students the opportunity to enroll in appropriate English and math courses in their senior year to strengthen their skills. The CSU uses the CAASPP/EAP English language arts/literacy and mathematics results as one of the multiple measures that can help place students in the appropriate first-year GE English and GE mathematics/QR courses.

Applying to a CSU?



Enroll in GE English (A2) Course

CAASPP/EAP English Test Score:

- Standard Exceeded (Level 4)
- Standard Met (Level 3) and completed 12th-grade-approved yearlong English course (C- or better)

High School Courses and GPA:

- Weighted GPA 3.3 or above
- Weighted GPA 3.0 or above and completed a 12th-grade-approved yearlong English course (C- or better)
- Weighted GPA 3.0 GPA or above and completed honors English course
- Weighted GPA 3.0 or above and completed five or more years of high school English

SAT English Test Score*:

- 550 or above
- 510–540 and completed a 12th-grade-approved yearlong English course (C- or better)

ACT English Test Score*:

- 22 or above
- 19–21 and completed a 12th-grade-approved yearlong English course (C- or better)

If you checked one of the boxes in this blue section **stop here**. You will be placed in a GE A2 English course.

If none of the criteria above apply, go to the next section



Enroll in GE Math Course

CAASPP/EAP Math Exam Score:

- Standard Exceeded (Level 4)
- Standard Met (Level 3) and completed 12th-grade-approved yearlong advanced math course beyond algebra II or integrated math III (C- or better)

High School Courses and GPA

- Weighted math GPA 3.5 and completed 12th-grade-approved yearlong advanced math course beyond algebra II or integrated math III (C- or better)
- Weighted math GPA 3.5 or above and five or more years of math or QR
- Weighted GPA 3.7 or above (C- or better)

SAT Math Test Score*:

- 570 or above
- 520–560 and completed 12th-grade-approved yearlong advanced math course beyond algebra II or integrated math III (C- or better)

ACT Math Test Score*:

- 23 or above
- 20–22 and completed 12th-grade-approved yearlong math course beyond algebra II or integrated math III (C- or better)

If you checked one of the boxes in this blue section **stop here**. You will be placed in a GE B4 math/QR course appropriate for your major.

If none of the criteria above apply, go to the next section

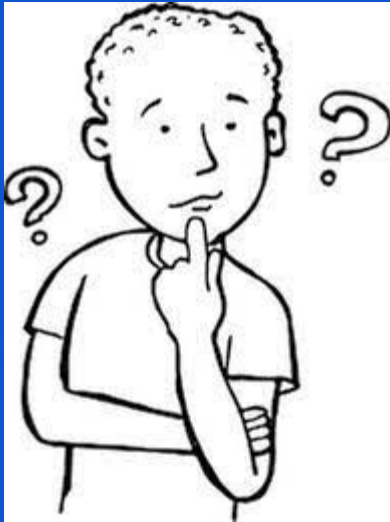

What is the State Seal of Biliteracy?

The State Seal of Biliteracy is a recognition by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for graduating high school students who have obtained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English. The State Seal of Biliteracy is marked by a gold seal affixed to the diploma or transcript.

How Can You Earn The California State Seal of Biliteracy?

To earn the California State Seal of Biliteracy, graduating high school seniors must demonstrate proficiency in English and one or more languages in addition to English. See reverse for details.

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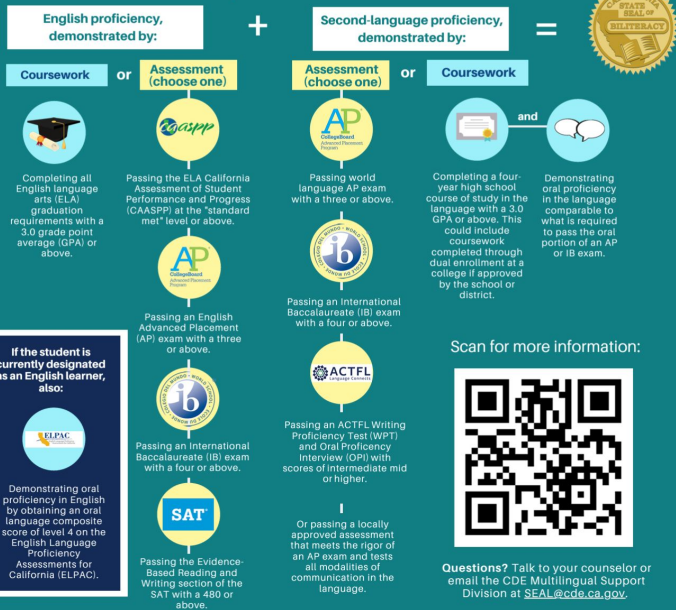

Golden State Seal Merit Diploma



The Golden State Seal Merit Diploma (GSSMD) insignia is awarded jointly by the California State Board of Education and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction to recognize students who have demonstrated mastery of the high school curriculum in at least six subject areas.

Each local educational agency that confers high school diplomas is required by state law to identify students who qualify and to affix the GSSMD insignia to the diploma and transcript of each qualifying graduate.

Approximately 100,000 graduates receive a GSSMD insignia affixed to their high school diploma each year.

Students must meet the eligibility requirements in the following subjects:

- English language arts
- Mathematics
- Science
- U.S. history
- Two subject matter areas selected by the student

Golden State Seal Merit Diploma Eligibility

Current eligibility requirements for the Golden State Seal Merit Diploma (GSSMD).



Local educational agencies (LEAs) are responsible for maintaining appropriate records in order to identify graduating seniors who meet the eligibility requirements for the Golden State Seal Merit Diploma (GSSMD) (California *Education Code* Section 51454). To be eligible for the GSSMD, students (1) must be eligible to receive a high school diploma; and (2) must have demonstrated the mastery of the curriculum in at least six subject areas, as follows:

1. English language arts/literacy (ELA)—students must have earned one of any of the following:
 - a. A grade of B+ or above (or numerical equivalent) in a single course (each semester) completed in grade nine or ten or eleven
 - b. An achievement level of “Standard Met” or above for the high school Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment
2. Mathematics—students must have earned one of any of the following:
 - a. A grade of B+ or above (or numeric equivalent) in a single course (each semester) completed in grade nine or ten or eleven
 - b. An achievement level of “Standard Met” or above for the high school Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment
3. Science—students must have earned one of any of the following:
 - a. A grade of B+ or above (or numeric equivalent) in a single course (each semester) completed in grade nine or ten or eleven
 - b. An achievement level of “Standard Met” or above for the high school California Science Test taken in grade ten or eleven
4. U.S. history—students must have earned one of any of the following:
 - a. A grade of B or above (or numerical equivalent) upon completion of the required U.S. history course (each semester)
 - b. A qualifying score that demonstrates mastery of the subject as determined by the LEA for an examination produced by a private provider or the LEA
5. Two additional subject areas—students may choose from any of the following:
 - a. Any additional qualifying grade or score listed above, earned for the subject of ELA, mathematics, science, or U.S. history not already used to meet eligibility
 - b. A grade of B or above (or numerical equivalent) upon the completion of high school courses in other subjects
 - c. A qualifying score that demonstrates mastery of other subjects, as determined by the LEA, for an examination produced by a private provider or the LEA

GOLDEN STATE SEAL of MERIT: Good to Know!!!!



CAASPP Scores weigh into the factors of whether or not a student receives the Golden State Seal of Merit on their transcript.

- Example: If a student has a GPA of less than the required 3.5 in Math, Science, or English, but receives a 3 or 4 on their CAASPP they still qualify for the seal.
- Example: If a student ends their junior year with a 3.4 GPA in Science and didn't take the CAST, they will be disqualified for the Seal of Merit.
 - However, if they end their junior year with a GPA of 3.4, but took the CAST and received a 3 or 4, the CAST score will meet the requirements for Science.
