If a student has a changing and/or uncertain housing situation, there are additional resources available to the student through McKinney Vento legislation.

Here's a list of what we often have to offer to support students covered by that legislation:

- clothing for school or work
- individualized tutoring help
- additional food for meals outside of school hours
- supplies for school and related projects
- transportation to/from school
- supplies or services related to health and/ or hygiene
- counseling support
- testing or field trip fees graduation supplies

There's an upload link there for your portrait image file, if you're not coming to Monday or Tuesday's Pop-Up event. Plus there's also a link to reserve your own copy of the 2024 yearbook. Don't wait til the last minute -- we've sold out the past two years in a row!

This is your year that you get the chance to replace your ID photo with a portrait that you choose, so choose to look your best in a custom portrait. And be sure to meet the 11/30 uploading deadline because there are no extensions or exceptions.

New NEO Youth Center opens November 6th at 200 Litton Drive, Suite 308, Grass Valley

The 3,700-square-foot NEO Youth Center will include a café, game area, music room, small stage, a flex room for multiple uses and a patio. The NEO Youth Center will be available for 11- to-25-year-old residents and offer a long list of after-school activities and occasional weekend events, from art workshops to live music and open mic nights.

The NEO Youth Center is the first large youth center in Nevada County – and the largest between Sacramento and Reno. The community came together to make the NEO Youth Center possible, with more than 100 individuals and small-business owners donating to the \$500,000 capital campaign for the project. The Del E. Webb Foundation awarded a \$150,000 grant and Gary Twing and Lynn Kerby, longtime community members, also provided a significant amount of funding.
