The CAASPP test is administered through the SBAC (Smarter Balance Assessment California System)

WHO IS TESTING?

9th Graders

Will take the practice SBAC for Literacy and Math.

10th Graders

Will take the practice SBAC for Literacy and Math.

11th Graders

Will take the Summative (official) SBAC for Literacy and Math and the CAST for Science.

12th Graders

Will only take the CAST for Science if they did not complete it last year as an 11th grader.

WHY CAASPP? Please take a moment to review this comprehensive slide deck to answer questions you may have.

• Early Assessment Program (EAP) - Exemption from placement tests, and remedial classes in

colleges.

- **Seal of Biliteracy -** You must take the CAASPP test to be eligible for the CA Seal of Biliteracy.
- **Scholarships -** Strong scores can factor into district and other available scholarships and funds.
- **Golden State Seal Merit Diploma -** A/B each semester in ELA/Math/Science/US History & Met Standards on CAASPP.
- **Transcripts -** Scores on CAASPP will be documented on Transcripts
- **Earn Pins -** To wear at Graduation Anyone that "Meets or Exceeds" Standards in both ELA/MATH
- **Home Prices!** Your community's home prices Our school's performance on state testing has a direct impact on the value of your family's home and the amount of money coming back to the school.
- Admissions to **competitive schools**.
- More **Money!** Indirectly better scores will attract more students.

12th-grade students will not be testing, as they tested last year unless they did not test in Science. There may be a few Seniors who did not test in Science last year so they will complete this test with the Juniors. This is not common.

TECH TEST

TechTest 2024 will take place **Saturday April 27** in the NUHS Science Lecture Hall, with a three-hour (9am-noon) merit scholarship test of your critical thinking and math skills. Participants celebrate together and receive t-shirts and prize checks at the Survivors Breakfast in Grass Valley.

Non-senior students are highly encouraged to participate. The regular prizes are limited to graduating seniors, but starting this year the highest scoring non-senior will also receive an award!

Awards (first four are available to current seniors only) 1st: \$6,000 2nd: \$4,000 3rd: \$2,000

Congressional Art Competition - From the Office of Congressman Kevin Kiley

Congressman Kevin Kiley's office is participating in this year's Congressional Art Competition, sponsored by the Congressional Institute, which recognizes the artistic talent of high schoolers across the country. - <u>A reception, where the winner will be announced, will be held on</u> <u>Saturday, April 27</u> at the Sierra <u>College Q Building</u> (5100 Sierra College Blvd, Rocklin, CA 95677). To see a map of the campus, click <u>here</u>. The reception will take place from <u>4:00pm – 6:00pm PT</u>.
 - Second and third place finishers will be eligible to have their artwork hung in Congressman Kiley's Washington D.C. and District offices, respectively.
 - All students who attend the reception will receive Congressional Honor from Congressman Kiley to recognize their work and participation in the competition.

There is no theme that the artwork must adhere to, however, please note that the artwork should be appropriate for being publicly displayed.

To participate in California's Third Congressional District's (CA-03) Art Competition, students must either reside or attend school in the district, which includes Nevada and Placer counties. Our help desk number is 530.272.9998 or <u>Helpdesk@njuhsd.com</u> they are ready to help you locate your previous login if needed. In order to enroll you will need:

Two DIFFERENT forms of address verification

- (ex: Driver License, PG&E bill, bank statement)
- Birth Certificate

• Immunization record (don't let this hold you up - you can get a copy from your current school - it's referred to as the "blue sheet".)

It is easiest to upload these documents when enrolling, but you are welcome to bring them into the office between the hours of 8:00-4:00 Mon-Fri, or you can email them to <u>nuregistration2024@njuhsd.com</u>
