FENTANYL AWARENESS NIGHT:

We have seen an uptick in fentanyl use cases in our community, state, and nation with some cases already this school year. In many cases the user may not even realize that they are ingesting fentanyl and they find themselves in need of immediate medical assistance. The purpose of the Fentanyl Awareness Night is to share information with families and community members. We will have school administration, law enforcement, and local agencies available to provide resources and knowledge that can help keep our community safe.

MYHB STUDENT SURVEY: MyHB (Mapping Youth Health Behavior)

On Wednesday and Thursday, October 25 & 26, all students will be participating in an **anonymous survey** to see if our [RAYS: Restorative Accountable Youth Solutions](#), an alternative program to suspension, has the desired impact on our campus. It aims to reduce both school suspensions and student substance use and is based in restorative practices. The program is evaluated by a team of researchers from UC San Diego who will anonymously survey all Nevada Union Students* in order to gather data around student substance use and knowledge. As part of the evaluation of the RAYS program, the MYHB survey seeks to better understand:

- Student use of substances
- Youth attitudes and exposure to these products
- Perceptions of harm associated with substance use

The survey will be administered as follows:

- Frosh / Soph: English class
- Junior / Senior: US History or Gov/Econ class
